

Safety Code



Respect for others

Behave in a way that does not endanger others.

Control speed

Adapt your speed to your ability and slope conditions.

Choose route

Adapt your line to not endanger slope users below.

Overtaking

Leave enough space for slope users below to make any movement – voluntary or involuntary. Those below always have right of way.

Entering/starting

Always check up and down hill before starting off or crossing a slope.

Stopping

Only stop when absolutely necessary and only do so at the side of the slope. After a fall, move over to the side of the slope as soon as possible.

Descending

Only descend on foot when absolutely necessary. If you must descend on foot, do so to the side of the slope.

Signs

Obey all signage – it is there for your safety.

Incidents

In case of an accident, you are duty bound to assist if necessary. Alert a member of the team.

Identification

Following an incident, all those involved, including all witnesses, must exchange details.

To use the main slope you must:

- Be able to control and link turns
- Be able to control speed and direction
- Be able to stop safely
- Be comfortable with variable piste conditions
- Be competent using a drag lift
- Be wearing a helmet and gloves
